Day One

Visit: Erie Maritime Museum

Test your skills at tying knots, loading a cannon, raising and lowering the mid mizzen mast, and watch sailing demonstrations aboard the Lettie G. Howard, a Fredonia-style schooner.

Eat: U Pick 6 Tap House

Specializing in wood-fired delights such as pizzas, flatbreads and stromboli, Tap House can easily accommodate larger groups.

Visit: Hagen History Center

Tour "The Story of Us" exhibit that tell the story of Erie's immigrant families and their impact on Erie's industrial growth.

Visit: Port Farms

Learn about this family-owned working farm through an educational program based on Pennsylvania academic standards including mathematics, language arts and science.

Eat: Quaker Steak & Lube

Visit: Asbury Woods
